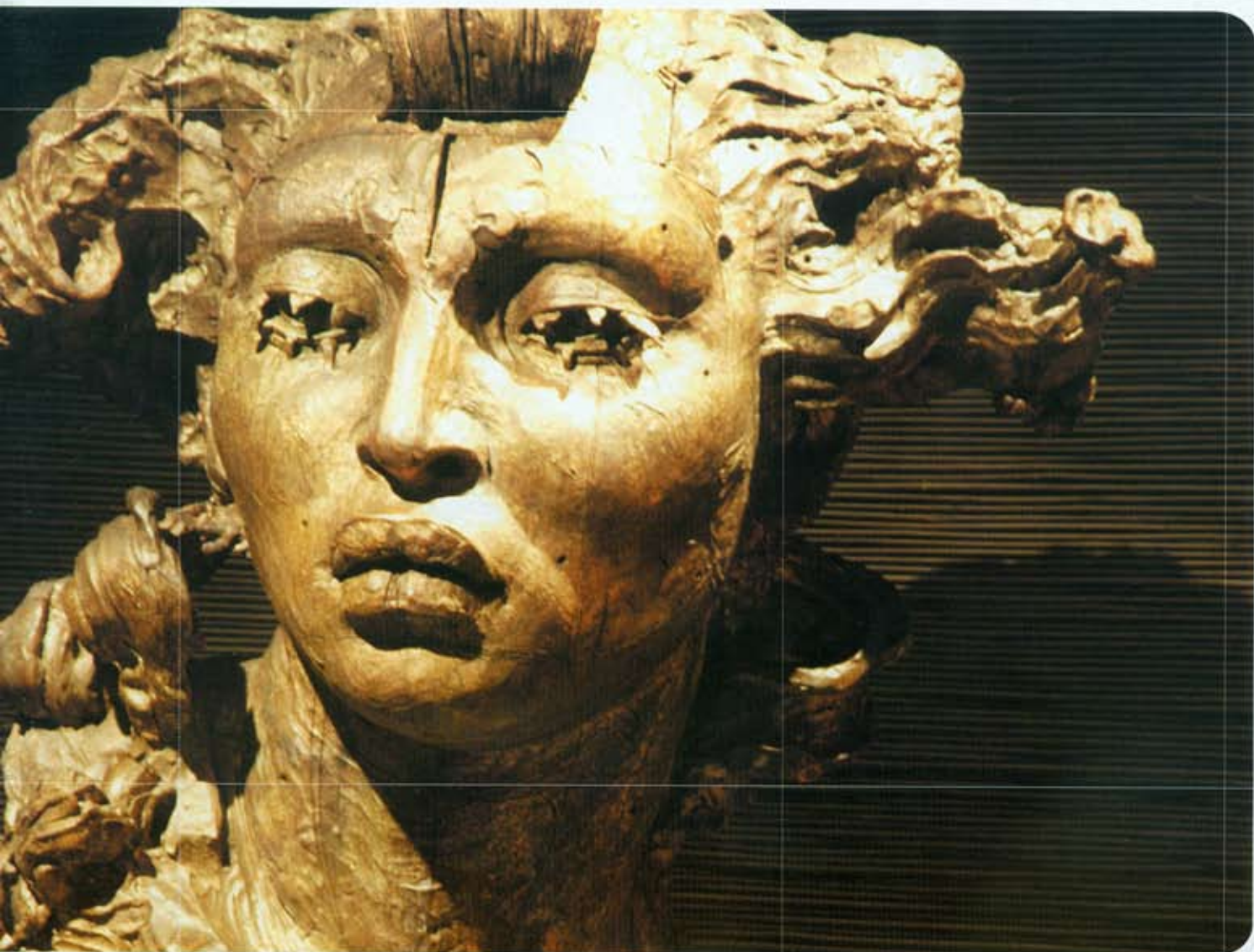

Changing Face of Jacksonville

KANKI JAPANESE STEAKHOUSE AND SUSHI BAR Thomas Duke Architects

Kanki Japanese Steakhouse recently opened its second restaurant on San Jose Boulevard in Mandarin.

The unique design features a raised curvilinear roof covered with Brazilian teak. An external atrium opens to a glass enclosed bamboo garden below. A forty-eight-foot wide opening on the southern exposure affords an outside view from any table.

The exterior walls are clad with porcelain tile. Water flows over black Mexican river rock, providing a buffer to the adjacent sidewalk and connects beneath the entrance to a contemporary Koi pond which surrounds an exterior patio.



Askewed steel columns reminiscent of large bamboo stalks support a zinc-clad canopy covering the outdoor dining area. The dynamic use of traditional and non-traditional materials create both a relaxing and fun experience.

Their selection was heavily influenced by the award winning Baughman Center at the University of Florida, and Mandi's Chapel in Live Oak at the Episcopal Camp and Conference Center. The selection

committee cited Zona's inspirational, soaring interior spaces, excellent site orientation and dramatic structural patterns which provide a powerful, yet calming spirit-filled ambiance.

This \$3.5 million, 18,000 square foot project includes two major elements: a Christian focused Learning Center for 125 children and an expanded Narthex, which will be the central focus of the four building campus with a stunning 75' steeple and cross.
